



Renee and Meyer Lusking Children's Clinic Reopens

The Renee and Meyer Luskin Children's Clinic of Los Angeles Orthopaedic Hospital has relocated to its new home in the Orthopaedic Hospital Institute of Santa Monica-UCLA Medical Center and Orthopaedic Hospital. The opening of the new hospital is the result of a strategic alliance between Los Angeles Orthopaedic Hospital (LAOH) and UCLA that began in 1998. It enhances each institution's capacity to lead advancements in musculoskeletal patient care, research and education throughout the world. Complementing this alliance is Renee and Meyer Luskin's extraordinary \$1,000,000 gift to LAOH — the single largest gift made by an individual benefactor during his or her lifetime in the 100-year history of the institution.
